

Mr Andrew Hayes MA PhD FRCS (Gen)

Mr Hayes is a Surgical Oncologist at the Skin Cancer Unit and the Sarcoma Unit at The Royal Marsden Hospital and the Institute of Cancer Research, London UK. He undertook his medical degree at Oxford University and St Bartholomew's Hospital, London and a PhD in the Lombardi Cancer Centre in Georgetown University Medical Center, Washington DC.

Mr Hayes has a specialist surgical practice in skin cancer, particularly advanced stage 3 and stage 4 melanoma, and soft-tissue sarcoma. He leads the Isolated Limb Perfusion programme at the Royal Marsden Hospital which provides a national service for regional chemotherapy for patients with advanced limb malignancy. He is head of the Royal Marsden Hospital's Skin Cancer Unit.

Mr Hayes has published widely on clinical aspects of melanoma and sarcoma and he runs a pre-clinical research programme at the Institute of Cancer Research in which he has developed oncolytic virotherapy as a new therapy in Isolated Limb Perfusion for the treatment of advanced irresectable limb malignancies, which is now under clinical evaluation in Phase 1 clinical trials.
